Jennifer Ladino is an assistant professor at the University of Idaho, where she teaches courses in American literature and literature and the environment, including Western American literature. She loves to teach authors like Sherman Alexie, Don DeLillo, Ruth Ozeki, Marianne Moore, and Wallace Stegner. She has published articles on these and other authors, as well as on films like *Grizzly Man* and *March of the Penguins*. Her forthcoming book, *Reclaiming Nostalgia: Longing for Nature in American Literature* (2012, University of Virginia Press) chronicles nostalgic narratives about nature since the closing of the frontier in 1890. Before joining the University of Idaho faculty, she taught at Creighton University, in Omaha, Nebraska. Jennifer was also a Fulbright Lecturer at the University of Bergen, Norway, in 2009–10, and she spent 13 summers as a park ranger in Grand Teton National Park.
