### What is a State Document?

Digital born state documents are published on the web rather than in print. They reside on an agency's website and contain important information not found anywhere else. These documents are created by the state agency that published them to their website.

Although it can be confusing, we can walk you through the steps of identifying digital born state documents. They are usually meant to be freely available to the public, contain unique information, and relate directly to the state agency's business.

### Software Upgrades



- *Contains unique information relating to the agency's business*
- *Intended to be dispersed to and to inform the public*
- *Presents the work of the state's business*
- *Legislatively mandated*
