



Traditional Package: 1 paper copy, 1 DVD (only if ordered in the spring)

---

DVD only

---

Online access code

---

**All formats come with online access!**

---

Upstart catalog

---

Important information regarding Rules of Use, Bright Futures, data collection, etc. --- READ!

---

Schools and community partners should partner with library to use copyright embedded graphics and program ideas

---

Can give schools and community partners incentive catalog

---

Cannot use graphics on website after March 31 following program year

# Best Practices in Summer Programming



## Parents as Reading Partners

The importance of reading aloud to children of all ages cannot be stressed enough, even for children who can read on their own. What are the benefits to be gained from reading aloud? Instilling a love of reading in your child, sharing more difficult books that your child may not be able to read alone, encouraging reluctant readers, and increasing family involvement through the sharing of good books are just some of the benefits.

The library is offering a "Parents as Reading Partners" program this summer to encourage you to increase the amount of time you spend reading to your children. When you sign up for the program, you agree to read aloud to your child on a regular basis. You set the amount of time. It doesn't matter whether it's 10 minutes or an hour a day. The contract provides space to record the books you read. At summer's end, return the contract to the library to receive a certificate. For each book you complete as a family, you may put your name on a token and enter a drawing for a family prize at the end of the summer. In addition, there are a variety of programs for families to enjoy at the library this summer.

We hope that both you and your family enjoy reading together and that you will discover some of the treasures of your library. Ask your librarian for suggestions of great read-aloud books.


