15 Ways to Use FlipCams in the Media Center

1. Interview students, staff or community members
2. Recording student presentations
3. Reading assessments (record student’s oral reading, use to evaluate progress)
4. Record a Lit circle (or any group interaction) to use as a sample of expectations
5. Record key elements of a lesson and make that available to students via webpage
6. Facilitate group reflection
7. Retell a story they have read
8. Reader’s Theater productions
9. Question of the Day / Brain Pop Quiz on Broadcast
10. Tours or Orientations
11. Reading response
12. Club advertisements
13. How-Tos
14. Presenting cases for problem-solving
15. Video casting of procedural progress of a class project

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
