A. MLS / Continuing Library Education - Discussion

Goal 1 in the agency's FY2019-FY2022 strategic plan is to build the institutional capacity of libraries to better serve their communities. The first strategy under that goal is to improve the library workforce. Leadership development, training, and continuing education for library staff are addressed in six other objectives in the plan. The outcome we strive for is that 80% of library staff attending our continuing education programs will report that they have made changes in their library procedures or services, or that they are better prepared as a result of their participation. Said another way, we want the participants to find our CE programs informative and relevant to their work.

The "Needs Assessment / Key External Factors" section of Goal 1 in the plan describes the environment in which we work, and the need to offer educational opportunities for a wide range of library workers – from those with no library experience to paraprofessionals to experienced librarians.

Following are statistics that reflect continuing library education activity in Idaho.

South Dakota, Wyoming, Idaho, and Montana (SWIM) jointly received a \$730,659 grant under the Institute for Museum and Library Services (IMLS) Laura Bush 21st Century Librarian Program. The objective of the three-year grant was to recruit and provide IMLS-funded scholarships to educate 50 librarians and school library media specialists from throughout the 4-state region to work in rural communities.

Of Idaho's 20 graduates, 12 received full scholarships from the IMLS grant; 8 received partial support. Of the 20, 14 (70%) are working in Idaho libraries, and 2 in Wyoming libraries.
