Program Details

"Fun and Games!" - Celebrate the importance of family reading with an Idaho Family Reading Week event in your library or community. The official week is November 9 - 15 but events can take place anytime in November. Publicly-funded school and public libraries can register to receive materials to help support a Family Reading Week event. The first 100 libraries to register will receive paperback giveaway books related to the theme (limits apply - see below). Public-school library partnerships and collaboration are encouraged to avoid duplication of events and resoures in your community.

All libraries, regardless of registration process, may utilize...

- The Idaho Family Reading Week themed artwork: poster/flyers, Facebook/website banners, letterhead, proclamation and press release templates;
- Themed activity videos for two age groups especially developed for Idaho Family Reading Week by Salmon Public Library (share links with parents and your patrons via your website, handouts or social media);
- Themed activity ideas/handouts, recommended reading lists, and parent handouts that support early literacy skills;

By applying for the Idaho Family Reading Week program, your library agrees to:

- host at least 1 family reading event by November 30, 2020; This year, due to the health pandemic, FRW events can be offered virtually, through curbside services, face-to-face in small groups or a combination of these delivery methods.
- include literacy-related activities and parent resources;
- · promote library programming, early literacy resources and library cards for all families;
- submit a summary event report including numbers served, narrative responses and program/resource feedback by December 15, 2020.

Book Request Info - Important Please Read:

Libraries may receive some FRW-themed and some non-themed paperback books to use as giveaways for children/families who participate in their event. ICfL cannot keep up with the current demand for paperback books for this event and other literacy outreach events we support.

Last year for FRW, the 100 libraries who registered requested 15,000 in books for their events. ICfL was able to scrape together 12,000 books to send out. This year, we are planning on distributing a total of 10,000 books.

Therefore, the following limits have been placed on paperback book requests from public libraries for this year's FRW events:

Understanding that, most likely, we will not be able to provide a book for all the chidlren you hope to serve at your event...Please limit your request to approx. 1 book per child (some extra cushion for wiggle room is fine) AND with a maximum of the following:

- Libraries serving over 50,000 patrons total request limit of 200 books
- Between 10,000 and 50,000 patrons total request limit of 150 books
- Between 5,000 and 10,000 patrons total request limit of 100 books
- Less than 5,000 patrons total request limit of 50 books

(NOTE: <u>Each</u> branch of a library can request paperbacks for the amounts listed above. Depending on library request amount, the first 20-40 books provided by ICfL will be higher quality, themed books. The remainder of the books provided, will be non-themed Scholastic package sets and Scholastic Bonus Books.
