

1899 the Columbian Club of Boise created the Idaho Commission for Libraries. Stagecoaches delivered "Traveling Libraries" (wooden boxes with books for every age) to Idaho settlements, mining camps, and outposts. 1901 The Idaho Legislature created the State Library with a budget of \$3,000. 1904, 100 communities were receiving books. The 1920s, every major city in Idaho boasted a library. 1957, the Idaho Legislature more than doubled the budget, enabling libraries to offer new services, like bookmobiles and children's story times. 1973, the Talking Book Library began to serve people whose disabilities made it difficult to use printed materials. 1970's, computer technology was ushered in, continuing today through the Libraries Linking Idaho Network (LIL) providing access to databases for every Idahoan, paid for by state dollars. July 1, 2006, the Idaho State Library became the Idaho Commission for Libraries.

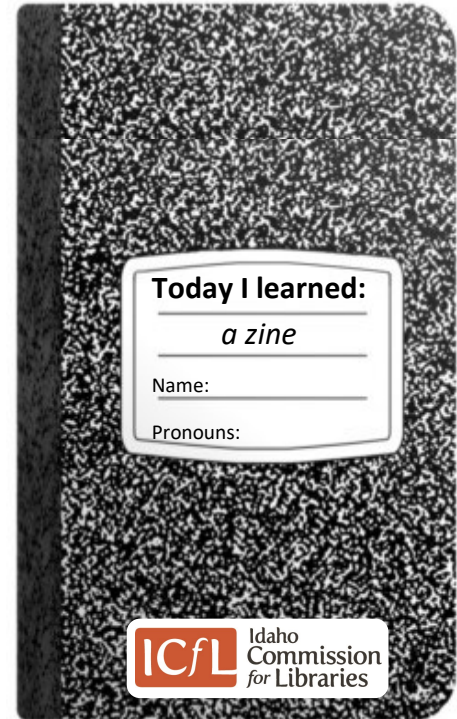
