




- Rolling Tools




Reflections


- Successes

- 1 yard woven fabric
- strip of fabric 7-9 inches by 44"-45" selvedge to selvedge
- Thread
- Sewing machine
- Pins
- Scissors
- Sewing practice sheet

 - Having kits available for checkout supplements what you've been teaching/encourages continued practicing


- Lessons Learned
