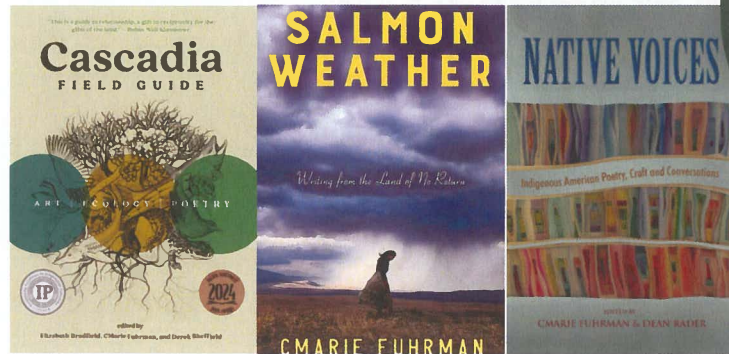

She has poetry and nonfiction published or forthcoming in a variety of publications, including *Terrain.org*, *Emergence Magazine*, *Alta Magazine*, *Northwest Review*, *Yellow Medicine Review*, *Poetry Northwest*, *Big Sky Journal*, and various anthologies. CMarie is the director of the Elk River Writers Workshop and an award-winning columnist for *The Inlander*. She is the Associate Director of the Graduate Program in Creative Writing at Western Colorado University, where she also teaches poetry and nature writing. CMarie is the host of *Terra Firma*, a Colorado Public Radio program, and has appeared in poetry films and nature documentaries. She is a former Idaho Writer in Residence and makes her home in the Salmon River Mountains of Idaho.

November in History

Did you know...?

November 1, 1848 - The first medical school for women opened in Boston. The Boston Female Medical School was founded by Samuel Gregory with just twelve students. In 1874, the school merged with the Boston University School of Medicine, becoming one of the first co-ed medical schools.

November 2, 1947 - The first and only flight of Howard Hughes' "Spruce Goose" flying boat occurred in Long Beach Harbor, California. It flew about a mile at an altitude of 70 feet. Costing \$25 million, the 200-ton plywood eight-engine Hercules was the world's largest airplane, designed, built and flown by Hughes. It later became a tourist attraction alongside the Queen Mary ship at Long Beach and has since been moved to Oregon.

November 7, 1989 - L. Douglas Wilder became the first African American governor in U.S. history, elected governor of Virginia.

November 14, 1666 - The first experimental blood transfusion took place in Britain, utilizing two dogs.

November 17, 1558 - Queen Elizabeth I ascended the throne of England at the age of 25, reigning until 1603 when she was 69. Under her leadership, England became a world power, defeating the Spanish Armada, and witnessed a golden age of literature featuring works by William Shakespeare, Edmund Spenser and others.

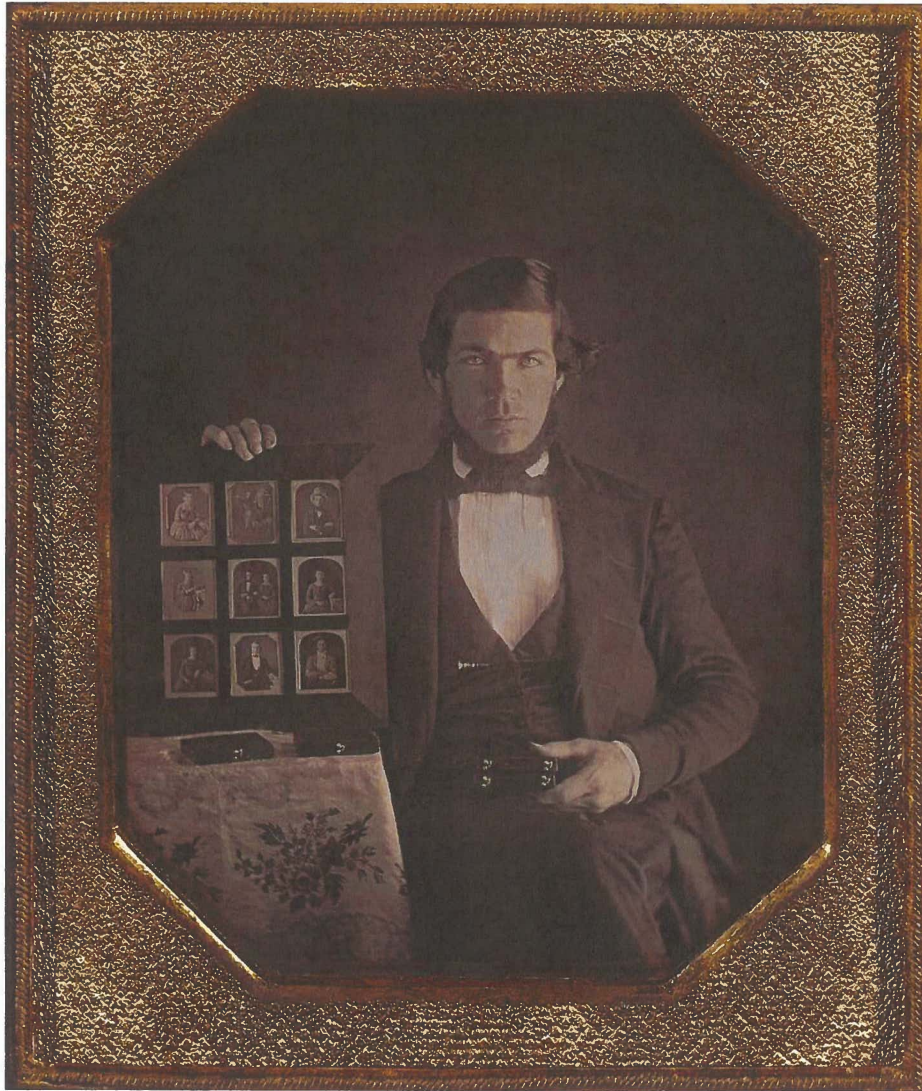
Birthday - Astronomer and mathematician Edmund Halley (1656-1742) was born in London. He sighted the Great Comet of 1682 (now named Halley's Comet) and foretold its reappearance in 1758. Halley's Comet appears once each generation with the average time between appearances being 76 years. It is expected to be visible again in 2061.

Birthday - Steamboat developer Robert Fulton (1765-1815) was born in rural Pennsylvania.

Birthday - Photography inventor Louis Daguerre (1789-1851) was born in Corneilles, near Paris. In 1839, at a meeting of the French Academy of Sciences, he announced his daguerreotype process, the first practical photographic process that produced lasting pictures.

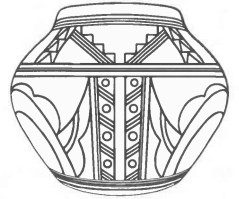
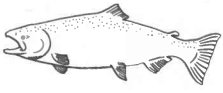

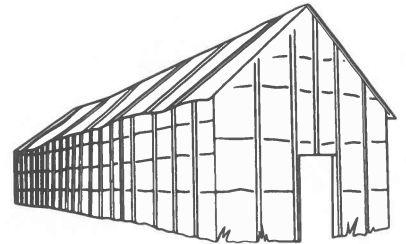
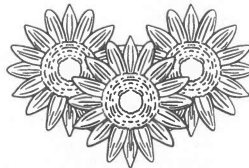
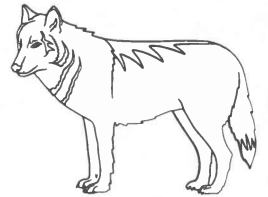
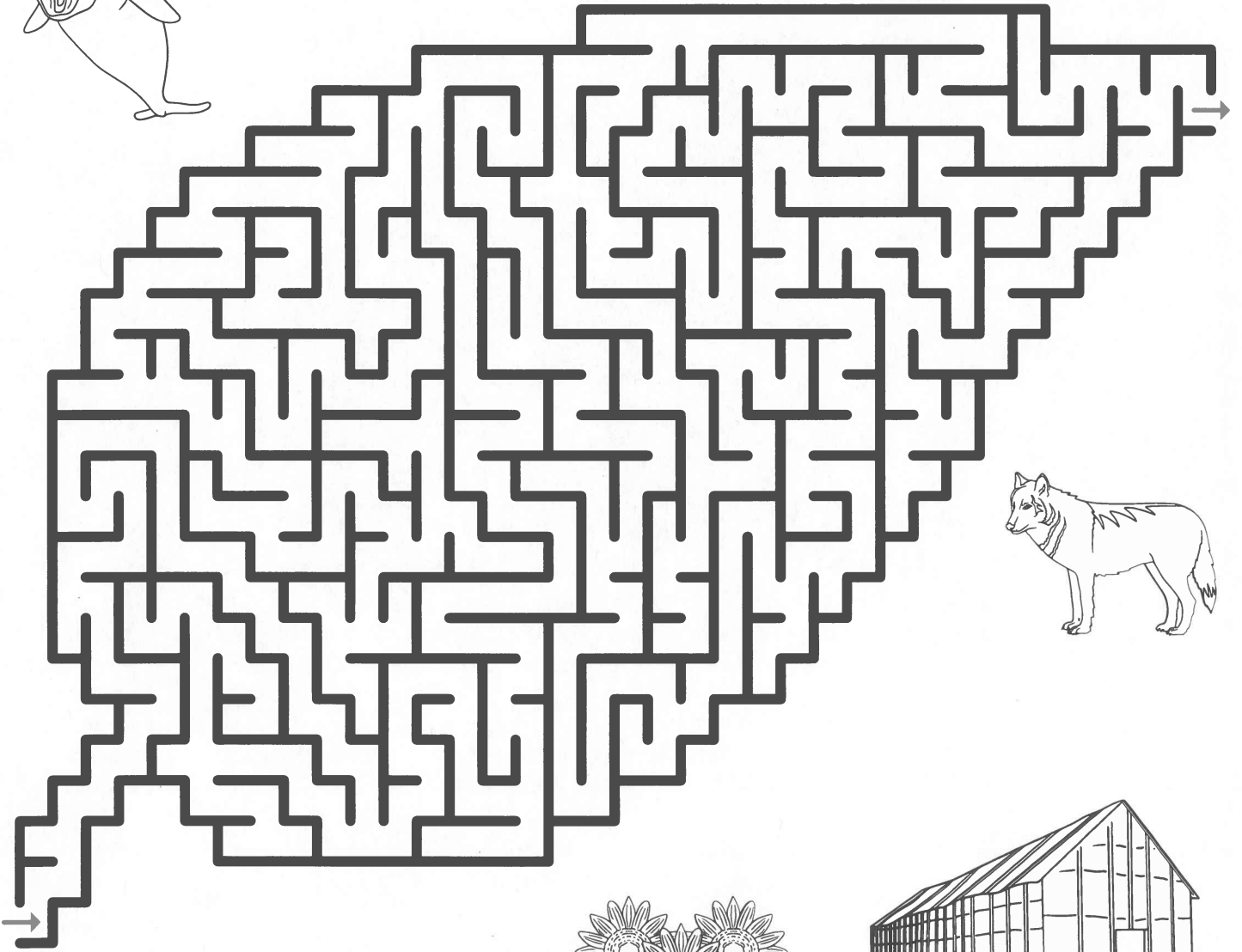
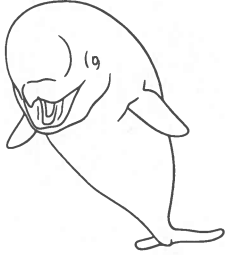


Daguerreotype portrait of a daguerreotypist displaying daguerreotypes and cases pictured in an airtight frame, 1845

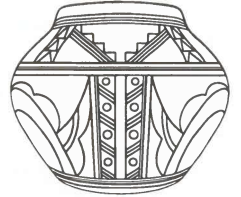
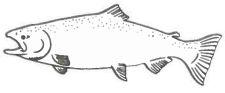
