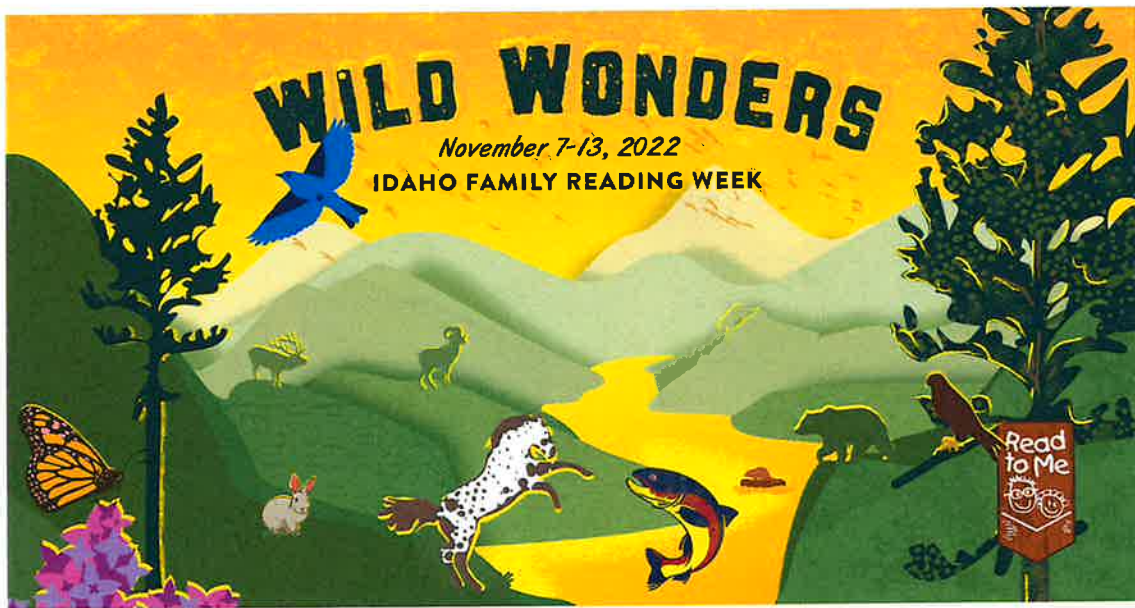


Idaho Family Reading Week 2022: "Wild Wonders"

Program Details:

"Wild Wonders" - Celebrate the importance of family reading with an Idaho Family Reading Week event in your library or community. The official week is November 7 - 13 but events can take place anytime in November. Just like last year, FRW events may be in-person, virtual, curbside, or a combination of any of the above. We just want it to be impactful and what works best for your community. Publicly-funded school and public libraries in Idaho can register to receive materials to help support a Family Reading Week event. The first 100 libraries to register will receive newly published hardcovers for the theme (for your library collection or Storytime Program), paperback giveaway books related to the theme (limits apply - see below), copies of Idaho Fish & Game's *Wildlife Express* Magazine, copies of *Kids of Idaho Love to Learn!* Activity Kits, and animal-fact bookmarks for youth participants. Public-school library partnerships and collaboration are encouraged to avoid duplication of events and resources in your community.

All Idaho libraries, whether they register for one of the 100 program spaces or not, may utilize the following resources from the FRW website:

- Idaho Family Reading Week themed artwork: downloadable posters/flyers, Facebook/website banners, letterhead, proclamation and press release templates;
- Google Choice Boards (3) full of related resources, educator guides, and lots of ideas for extension activities;
- Digital copy of Idaho Fish & Game's *Wildlife Express* Magazine;
- Digital resources such as art activities, animal quizzes/Kahoots, virtual field trips, and more animal themed ideas;
- Idaho Digital E-Book Alliance (IDEA) e-book list created specifically for FRW;
- Recommended themed reading lists and parent handouts that support early literacy skills.

Program Requirements:

By applying for the Idaho Family Reading Week program, your library agrees to:

- host at least 1 family reading event by November 30, 2022;
- event activities should be literacy-related. Remember, the focus of Idaho Family Reading Week is literacy skills and getting kids & families excited about reading and using the library on a regular basis!
- promote library programming, early literacy resources, and library cards for all families/participants;
- submit a summary event report including numbers served, narrative responses and program/resource feedback by December 15, 2022.

In addition to the 4 themed, hardcover titles outlined on our website, participating libraries may receive some FRW-themed paperback books to use as giveaways for children/families who participate in their event. (**NOTE:** Not every single book supplied will be about animals, but most of them will be!) In an effort to give some high-quality books to each of the 100 libraries who register and to streamline our internal book shipping process, ICfL will provide the following pre-set book amounts to each participating library based on the size of your library:

- **Small** public libraries serving 5,000 patrons or less = 50 FRW books for ages preK-8th
- **Medium** public libraries serving 5,000 to 30,000 patrons = 70 FRW books for ages preK-8th
- **Large** public libraries serving more than 30,000 patrons = 90 FRW books for ages preK-8th

(NOTE: Each branch of a library district can request paperbacks for the amounts listed above.)

This year we have partnered with Idaho Fish & Game to bring you an animal-themed resource perfect for Idaho Family Reading Week participants - the *Wildlife Express Magazine: State Emblems* issue. You can print off a guide for your use.) ICfL has printed 7,500 copies of this color magazine so that participating FRW library's may request copies to give to children at their events.



In an effort to make sure there are some Wildlife Express magazines available for each participating library (that's 100 libraries!), we are suggesting the following request guideline for this resource:

- Small libraries: up to 50 copies
- Medium libraries: up to 75 copies
- Large libraries: up to 100 copies

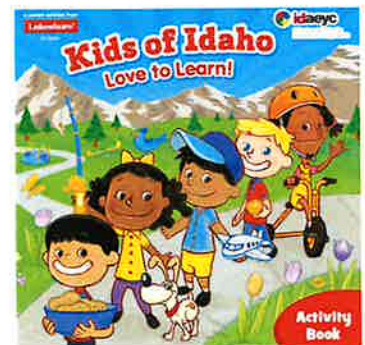

Kids of Idaho Love to Learn! Activity Kits:

This year we have partnered with the Idaho Association for the Education of Young Children (IDAEYC) to bring you a literacy-based resource perfect for Idaho Family Reading Week participants - the *Kids of Idaho Love to Learn!* Activity Kit (targeted for kids ages 4-7, but all kids may enjoy it). These kits come in English and Spanish. IDAEYC is providing 12,000 kits (11,000 in English and 1,000 in Spanish) to ICfL in support of Family Reading week. This activity kit includes the following learning materials:

- o 32-page Kids of Idaho activity book
- o Crayons
- o Colored pencils
- o Blank books (5)
- o Triangular pencils (3)
- o Pencil sharpener
- o Magnifying glass with Activity Card
- o Measuring tape with Activity Card
- o Custom name plates (4)
- o The kits are packaged in a Lakeshore Learning customized plastic tote bag



Participating FRW libraries may request kits to give to the children who attend their FRW events.

In an effort to make sure there are some IDAEYC activity kits available for each participating library, we are suggesting a request range of 20 - 200.
