Program Details

"Believe & Achieve" - Celebrate the importance of family reading with an Idaho Family Reading Week event in your library or community. The official week is November 8 - 14 but events can take place anytime in November. This year, FRW events may be in-person, virtual, curbside, or a combination of any of the above. Publicly-funded school and public libraries in Idaho can register to receive materials to help support a Family Reading Week event. The first 100 libraries to register will receive newly published hardcovers for the theme, pre-printed student "Believe and Achieve" journals, and paperback giveaway books related to the theme (limits apply - see below). Public-school library partnerships and collaboration are encouraged to avoid duplication of events and resoures in your community.

All Idaho libraries, whether they register for one of the 100 program spaces or not, may utilize the following resources from the FRW website:

- The Idaho Family Reading Week themed artwork: downloadable posters/flyers, Facebook/website banners, letterhead, proclamation and press release templates;
- Student "Believe and Achieve" journals that you print your self art/content downloadable from website,
- Themed story time outline,
- · Educator book guides,
- Author talk info for Pura's Cuentos (Idaho author)
- Recommended themed reading lists and parent handouts that support early literacy skills.

 concerns regarding the spread of COVID, FRW events can be offered in-person,
 virtually, through curbside services/grab-n-go kits, outdoors or a combination of any of
 these delivery methods.
- include literacy-related activities and parent resources in your event remember the focus
 of Family Reading Week is literacy skills and getting kids & families excited about
 reading and using the library!
- promote library programming, early literacy resources and library cards for all families;
- submit a summary event report including numbers served, narrative responses and program/resource feedback by December 15, 2021.

Paperback Book Request Info - Important Please Read:

In addition to the 5 themed, hardcover titles outlined on our website, participating libraries may receive some FRW-themed paperback books to use as giveaways for children/families who participate in their event. In an effort to give some high-qaulity books to each of the 100 libraries who register and to streamline our internal book shipping process, ICfL will provide the following pre-set book amounts to each participating library based on the size of your library:

 Small public libraries serving 5,000 patrons or less = 30 FRW books for ages preK-8th

- Medium public libraries serving 5,000 to 30,000 patrons = 50 FRW books for ages preK-8th
- Large public libraries serving more than 30,000 patrons = 75 FRW books for ages preK-8th

(NOTE: Each branch of a library district can request paperbacks for the amounts listed above.)
