WHAT IS CREATIVE AGING?

The Creative Aging Arts Education Model is proven to improve older adults' health and wellness, bringing a revived sense of self and purpose to their lives. While these instructional programs are responsive, they share key elements.

These programs:

- Are led by practicing teaching artists (non-volunteers)
- Build artistic skills over time (across all disciplines)
- Integrate social engagement
- Include a culminating event to publicly celebrate older adults' creativity

SEEKING HOST LIBRARIES

- We are looking for libraries that wish to host a hands-on, artist-led workshop geared toward serving older adults
- Workshops can focus on the art form of your choosing (memoir writing, crochet, leatherworking, etc!)
- Workshops will be ~8 weeks long
- Conclude with a culminating event celebrating the workshop



PROJECT TIMELINE

- August 1-30: Invite prospective site partners, libraries and arts and cultural nonprofits
- **September 1-29:** Meet with prospective site partners
- **September 30**: Identify 5 pilot residency sites
- November 8: Teaching artists and site contracts confirmed
- January-May: Workshops underway; 2-3 remote meetings with cohort of site hosts
- June 6, 2024: Creative Aging Statewide Convening in Boise



RESPONSIBILITIES

Arts Idaho will:

- Select host sites
- Contract with partner libraries to create and assess workshops
- Help find a teaching artist
- Study these pilot workshops to learn more about the Creative Aging model in Idaho

Library partners will:

- Choose artistic discipline
- Confirm teaching artist and help them meet library protocols for guest facilitators
- Schedule and promote the workshop
- Purchase supplies
- Pay the teaching artist
- Provide space and a staff member to help facilitate
- Participate in program cohort meetings and assessment (<3 hours)



FINANCIAL DETAILS

- Lifetime Arts is funding this initiative through a grant from the Smith Charitable Trust
- Arts Idaho would contract with your library for \$2,000 to complete one 8 week workshop and assessments
- Using contract funds, your library would pay the teaching artist and procure materials
