Originally prompted by growing public and professional interest in Native American cultures, this classic study of the Indians of Idaho provides a wealth of information on the social organization, customs, environmental orientation, and physical way of life of the tribes of the state. It surveys the aboriginal American Indian cultures in Idaho from the standpoint of ethnology or cultural anthropology, building upon the work of the field archaeologist in order to achieve interpretive insights never before possible. Relying upon a panoply of both early and contemporary resources, Deward E. Walker, Jr. paints a rich picture of Indian life. This is a sensitive and accurate survey of the ways of life of Idaho's native people, including the Kutenai, Kalispell, Coeur d'Alene, Nez Perce, Shoshone-Bannock, and Northern Paiute. Scholars, teachers, and students alike will find it an invaluable resource for understanding and communicating the cultural realities of Indian life.
