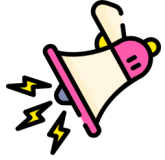


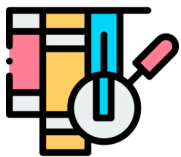

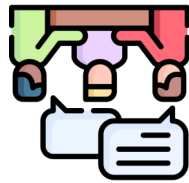

 and enlightenment.

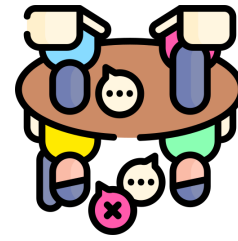
6. Libraries which make
 exhibit spaces and meeting
 rooms available to the
 public they serve should
 make such facilities
 available on an equitable
 basis, regardless of the
 beliefs or affiliations of
 individuals or groups
 requesting their use.



7. All people, regardless
 of origin, age,
 background, or views,
 possess a right to privacy
 and confidentiality in
 their library use.

2. Libraries should provide materials and information
 presenting all points of view on current and historical
 issues. Materials should not be proscribed or removed
 because of partisan or doctrinal disapproval.



1. Books and other library
 resources should be
 provided for the interest,
 information, and
 enlightenment of all
 people of the community
 the library serves.



Materials should not
 be excluded because
 of the origin,
 background, or views
 of those contributing
 to their creation.
