Idaho Students Have Free Access to LearningExpress

BOISE, Idaho --Idaho students, from elementary school through college, have free, 24/7 access to the expansive LearningExpress Library of tools and resources through the <u>lili.org</u> platform, provided by the Idaho Commission for Libraries (ICfL).

Younger students can improve their mathematics and English language skills through a variety of practices, videos, and microlessons. Within each category are multiple modules to help students build their skills. The material is aligned with Common Core State Standards.

On LearningExpress, there is expanded mathematics and English language material for middle school students, along with tutorials, geography and American history practice, and preparation for high school entrance exams.

High school students find skills improvement material for mathematics, English language arts, science, social studies, logic and reasoning, and technology. Each category contains learning resources such as videos, games, flashcards, e-books, and practice sets.

The high school equivalency center prepares users to take the GED test.

LearningExpress includes appropriate material for college students, including tutorials and practice sets for math, reading, grammar, and science, along with preparation for college placement, CLEP®, and graduate school admissions exams.

The career preparation section of LearningExpress includes career information and practice exams required by various professions. This material can greatly assist a high school or college student in determining a profession that appeals to them. Users can also sharpen their software skills through LearningExpress.
